Most KNU classes are three-credit courses and in order to get</p>

	<p>three credits in KNU, students have to complete 45 hours of studies (3 hours X 15 weeks). (1 course = 3 US credits, 45 class hours per semester, including exam period)</p> <p>Undergraduate : Maximum number of credit that undergraduate students can take per semester is 21 credit (seven courses) including three internship credit.</p> <p>Graduate : Maximum number of credit that graduate students can take per semester is 9 credit (three courses) including three internship credit.</p>

If provided, please give information about registration deadlines, cost, etc.	<p>Students can apply for on-campus housing to be assigned to a shared room in one of several on-campus dormitories. The dormitory fee for one semester can range from around US \$500 to \$1,000, depending on the meal plan (which is optional). This application should be completed separately by online application before the start of the semester.</p> <p>Medical certificate is required confirming the absence of tuberculosis (should be submitted within two months from the time of test results).</p>

Insurance requirements	<p>All international students in Korea are subject to mandatory enrolment in the National Health Insurance Service (NHIS). The estimated cost is approximately US\$60/ month.</p> <p>Medical-Exam Certificate (Confirming Absence of Tuberculosis) According to a new legislation by the Korean government, the KNU housing office requires all dormitory residents to submit a medical certificate including a doctor's note in English or Korean, confirming the absence of tuberculosis.</p>

Other relevant information	<p>On average, two exchange students will be paired with one Korean KNU student buddy to assist with settling into their new lives in Korea, communication, and cultural exchange.</p> <p>For the visa application, students are required to prove that they have sufficient funds to live in Korea (9000USD).</p>
